

Code of Conduct for Children and Young People

(adapted from NSPCC CPSU guidelines reviewed Oct 2024)

As a young person coming to Flavours, we'd like you to:

The essentials

- ✓ Listen to the chef and follow their instructions
- ✓ Behave responsibly, respectfully and safely
- ✓ Speak out if you feel worried or concerned reach out to one of our members of staff for support
- √ When you're with us, stay in the place where you are supposed to don't wander off into other areas of our school without telling a member of staff
- ✓ Take care of our equipment and school as if it were your own
- ✓ Make it to sessions on time and stay for the duration of the session.
- ✓ Do not vape or smoke on or near our premises during sessions

Behaviour

- ✓ Celebrate difference in our school and not discriminate against anyone
- ✓ Report any incidents of bullying to a member of staff
- ✓ Treat others with respect and appreciate that everyone has different levels of skill
- ✓ Support and encourage others
- Respect everyone participating (staff, other young people, parents)
- ✓ Celebrate success and accept that sometimes things go wrong

We understand you have the right to:

- ✓ Have fun and enjoy the time you spend with us
- ✓ Know that you're safe
- ✓ Know who can talk to if something isn't right
- ✓ Be listened to and feel valued
- ✓ Be respected by us and your peers
- ✓ Be treated fairly
- ✓ Feel welcomed and included
- ✓ Feel encouraged to develop your skills with our support (commercial group settings are 1 adult to 12 young people, with access to 1 additional support staff on site)
- ✓ Be looked after and supported if there is an accident or injury.

As a kitchen, we are a **high-risk activity**. We use **gas hobs, electric ovens, knives, and graters** as well as **hot equipment**.

We expect all young people to follow this code and work independently in our setting. If anyone behaves in a way that contradicts any of the points set out above, we'll address the problem straight away with the parent or carer's involvement.

Continued issues and and repeated breaches of this code may result in us regrettably asking you to leave the school permenantly, for the welfare of yourself and others.
